Breast-Health Masterclass

On average, we spend more than a third of our lives at work. The importance of creating positive working environments that support the physical, mental and emotional health of employees is therefore paramount. Supportive workplaces boost morale, increase motivation and productivity, reduce burnout and improve recruitment and retention.

The Breast Health Masterclass is delivered in-person or online comprising of Future Dreams Breast Cancer Charity representatives, healthcare professionals and breast cancer patients.

Each session is bespoke and tailored to requirements and can include:

- Future Dreams Breast cancer resources
- · Self-checking demo
- · Guidance on what to do if you notice anything new
- · How to support a family member, friend or colleague
- Signposting to Future Dreams House Breast Cancer Support Centre for online and in-person support

Follow up sessions can be arranged to cover a broader range of specialist speakers and subjects for example fertility, secondary breast cancer, menopause, mental health, nutrition & exercise and returning to work/HR.

Future Dreams Breast Cancer Charity

Future Dreams is a registered charity that provides practical and emotional support, promotes breast health awareness and funds secondary breast cancer research.

We raise awareness of the importance of self-checking, educate about breast cancer signs and symptoms promoting the importance of early detection whilst normalising conversations in the workplace that could potentially save lives.

We work with companies and community groups to empower employees to prioritise their staffs wellbeing and the Breast Health Masterclass will support your employee wellbeing programmes and CSR.

Future Dreams Breast Cancer Charity was founded by Danielle Leslie and her mother, Sylvie Henry in 2008 after both were diagnosed with breast cancer and they were determined that no one should face breast cancer alone, working tirelessly to raise vital funds for support, awareness and research. Tragically, both lost their lives to the disease within a year of each other in 2009 but their legacy lives on in all those who access our services and support our cause. In 2021 the charity opened Future Dreams House in Kings Cross, London, the only dedicated breast cancer support centre in the UK.

Other Information

Masterclasses are available in-person or online and are free to charge to community groups supporting individuals with specific needs or experiencing economic or social difficulties.

We do ask companies for a contribution starting from £2,000 to cover costs of each workshop and these contributions allow us to widen our program by offering free of charge awareness workshops to community groups.
